

Evening Division Course Sequencing

Scheduling for evening students is somewhat complicated by the fact there are fewer evening class hours. To assist evening students, this chart details a framework for choosing classes over the final three years of an evening student's program. Please note that due to a variety of factors (e.g. professor sabbatical), a particular required or bar staple course may switch semesters in a particular year. In addition, each individual student may have valid reasons for departing from this framework. Please do not hesitate to set-up an appointment to discuss your particular goals.

Part-time, evening division students must take a minimum of 8 credits each semester and are limited to a maximum of 12 credits each semester. At least one summer semester of 3 or 4 credits is highly recommended to allow you greater flexibility over your four years.
